Beyond the previously listed items, we have included a sample letter you may elect to send to the parents and guardians of your students informing them of this curriculum, its contents and purpose. Please feel free to make any necessary changes to the letter, adding any additional information you wish.

Part of this program requires the use of sample transcripts from your high school. We suggest you use transcripts that show trends for different scenarios, such as: the student that started strong and ended weak, the student that was consistently strong on the AP and Honors track, the student that started weak and ended strong and the student that never completed high school. Please make sure to exclude any personal, non-public information on the sample transcripts.

We suggest that you prepare packets of information in advance to distribute to the students at the beginning of your presentation. Doing so will avoid disruptions during your program.
